

Elliott Daniels biography

Elliott Daniels is an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of South Carolina, where he prosecutes violent crime, human trafficking and child exploitation, and white collar crimes, among other federal criminal offenses. He is the U.S. Attorney's Office point of contact on human trafficking for the Columbia division.

Prior to his current position, he practiced in the area of civil defense, where he also led a statewide network that provided counsel and direct representation to more than 40 survivors of trafficking. He has led the Legal Innovation Subcommittee on the S.C. Human Trafficking Task Force and served as a S.C. delegate to a regional federal workgroup coordinating states' best practices in their response to trafficking.

Elliott obtained his undergraduate and law degrees from the George Washington University. Elliott and his wife are from the Lowcountry, and they now live in Columbia with their two daughters.
